When I came to Concordia a little over a year ago, one of the things that really impressed me was the fact First UMC had its own purpose statement: Belong, Believe, Become. I think that is one of the coolest purpose statements I've ever seen.

Over the course of the last year (or so), one of the things I've wrestled with is what does "Belong, Believe, Become" mean, and how do we go about fulfilling it? How do I, as a pastor, grow into it and invite others to grow into it? That is a conversation I plan to have with the administrative council in September. (I meant have the discussion in August but I was kinda brain dead at the meeting after attending a workshop all day.)

Clearly, there has been some intentional planning going on before I was blessed to move to Concordia, so people have a place to belong, believe and become through healthy congregations and the neighboring programs, Change the World Sunday, and other ministries. But, again, I ask the question: What does belong, believe, become mean and how do I, as your pastor, fulfill it, and invite others to grow into it?

It isn't that I'm questioning whether it is or has been, fulfilled. In some ways I think people discover they can belong, believe, and become part of First UMC and it's ministries. What I am also saying, however, is that I am evaluating steps forward. Maybe there is a personal side of this for me given my life circumstances, but in visiting with one of my mentors, I think there's something more. It's like an itch that needs scratched.

One of the ways to scratch that itch was suggested by Bishop Ruben Saenz when he was the Great Plains bishop. Bishop Saenz met with Kansas NAMI director Sherrie Vaugh to learn about how caring for those living with mental illness and family members with loved ones who struggle with mental health can be cared for by the church.

Years ago, I was shocked to learn how the Gerasene demoniac was likely an alcoholic who had been rejected by his first century community until Jesus came and healed him. I remember another occasion where Jesus healed a woman who was possessed by demons. And there are countless other stories of the healings Jesus performed with a variety of people. That suggests, to me, that offering healing to others should be a central part of what we do as a church, and that requires stepping out of our comfort zones.

For that reason, I invited NAMI to present its Standing in the Gap presentation last month – and thank you to everyone who helped with it – and for that reason I am taking part in conversations to explore avenues of community care with those living with mental illness, addiction(s), and poverty. There are clear links between the three areas, and I think they're best addressed by including several folks in the discussion, and it's why I'm working with NAMI to establish something more detailed for North Central Kansas. If some of you want to be involved in this, please feel free to email, call, text me or visit with me in person. I'd welcome the feedback.

One final note: Since moving to Concordia, I have to confess I've been a little lazy getting back into eating and exercising like I should for my health and self -care. For those of you interested in prioritizing your self-care and fitness, please let me know. Maybe there's something we can work on together. Once I am back up to snuff, I will be back on my bike regularly again.

So, until next month ... just keep pedaling. Pastor Mark Crist








Emotionally Healthy Spirituality
