Pastor's peddling's:

Recently, there have been some minor tweakings to our worship service, and I'm curious to know who has noticed? Last Sunday (September 22) was the first Sunday for the tweakings: holy conversation and sharing the mission/purpose statement.

The first tweaking incorporated what we're calling a "Holy Conversation" question. The Holy Conversation is a focus question based on the passage or passages I will be preaching from that day to start a conversation before the message is given.

The idea is a result of the Small Church Advantage workshops that Pam, Lisa, Angie, and I have attended since February (there were three workshops in total). Part of the reason for the conversation is to invite folks to think about what their answer(s) would be to the question. Another part of the reason for the conversation is to inspire and encourage folks, so worship is more participatory. Eventually, I hope folks in the church will one day submit questions they'd like to invite others to discuss.

And really, discussion that leads to action is what the Christian faith is all about, isn't it? By discussing things, we get to know one another better. Sometimes by discussing things, we get to know something about someone in the pew next to us we never knew, and sometimes discussion helps us learn another's story, which fosters understanding and friendship. Something I really like about the Holy Conversation is that it is something

folks can take home with themselves or something that can generate conversation when folks go out for lunch after worship. As a former journalist, one of the things I appreciated most about that professional pursuit was asking people the "who, what, where, why, and how" questions, so I could learn about them and their story. Stories are what connect us. Jesus knew this, that's why he told parabolic stories to explain what he was endeavoring to teach. I'd never go back to journalism, but I definitely appreciated that aspect of the work.

Something else I'm looking forward to doing is developing a story a month for the newsletter about members of the church like I might have as a journalist, and then publishing their story in the newsletter. I had wanted to do this with Beth Whisler when she was diagnosed with stage 4 cancer almost a year ago, but the timing of everything never transpired. The story could be about a hobby someone has (like gardening, painting, woodworking, etc.) or about their personal story, for those willing to share it.

Lastly, the second tweaking was thanks to the administrative council, where we participate in saying the church's mission and belief statement to wrap up the service, as a reminder of who we are as Concordia First United Methodist followers of Christ, and what we can do to invite others to join us. I heard some really positive feedback about that last Sunday.

So, I would welcome having folks participate in this. Please let me know what inspirational stories you have to share or know others may have to share, so they can be something everyone can enjoy.

The kitchen renovation project is underway! The cabinets have been sanded and are ready for paint, flooring is being installed, and the counter tops are ready to install. Safety Team Update

In June of 2023, Lyle Pounds and Nancy Wentz attended a seminar hosted by the Cloud County Emergency Preparedness team and learned about how to make our facility safer. The same day as the seminar, a representative from the DHS Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency completed an assessment of our facility and surrounding property. A safety team was subsequent formed to discuss and address security concerns. The team members include: David Edwards, Marcy Johnson, Amanda Morgan, Lyle Pounds, Loren Swenson, Monte Wentz, Nancy Wentz., and Rev. Mark Crist.

The team has implemented a security plan and provided training to the congregation. The team also spent significant time gathering estimates on upgrades and equipment to harden our facility and make it safer. In May of 2024, a grant application was submitted to the Non-Profit Security Grant Program administered through FEMA. **Recently, the team was notified that Concordia FUMC is a grant recipient!** The process for finalizing estimates and learning how the grant program works will start this fall. Work will start next year and continue through 2027. Watch for more details in the coming months!




