Pastor's Pedalings

As I write this month's pedalings, I have several things coursing through my head because there are so many topics I could write about this month with the presidential election coming up, strategic planning starting in January, church conference on November 17 in Salina, the things I'm learning from the National Association for Mental Illness (NAMI), and a slew of other things. Usually when I write the pedalings, I am much more focused than I feel today.

Recently, I had someone ask me which political candidate I'd be voting for this year, and my response was simple: I will be voting for the candidate I believe is best suited to lead the country so the democracy benefits the greatest number of people. I will not, however, name the candidate I will be voting for.

The second thing I mentioned was strategic planning. That process has already been initiated at Trinity but the administrative council at First wanted to hold off until January to work on a strategic plan, and I think everyone can be grateful for that with as much as we have going on now through the end of December. I know I'm grateful to wait until then because the added work can be quite demanding. Holding off also buys me time to get some significant reading that applies to strategic planning completed.

When I was in seminary, I remember overhearing some of my classmates complaining about how much reading we had to do and all the assignments we had to write. Since I'd been serving the church about four or five years when I started seminary, I understood how much reading was involved just to serve the church, so I laughed when I overheard that comment. Now, I am glad we had to do all that reading because there is just as much reading I do now as I did then, although I am nowhere near as quick at reading as I used to be.


Now, for church conference. Church conferences have to be held annually largely due to IRS expectations, but where they often help me the most are with the goals that get set. Sometimes the goals that are set for the conference have to be flexible because things change in the course of a year, but what I like about the goals is that they give me an idea of how I can best lead the church. As I grow into leadership, the goals that are suggested play a significant role.

And now, for NAMI. I first got involved with NAMI when I was serving in my prior appointment. Somehow, I ended up on the state governing board for NAMI and kinda wobbled my way through the process because I really didn't know very much about the organization. Since coming to Concordia, however, I have found NAMI to be a real blessing because it is grounded in several principles of the Christian faith as it sets up networks to assist in the care of people who have mental illness or families with loved ones who are living with mental illness.

So far, I've attended two Standing in the Gap workshops, one of which we hosted in August, and I've been a panelist a couple times because of my experiences with mental health. I've also attended the Family to Family online class, and I'm currently enrolled in the Peer to Peer online class, which is Thursday evenings right now. I attended the Pathways of Hope conference a few months ago, and I attended NAMI's annual "conference" meeting. I have also been asked to develop a strategic planning team to develop a NAMI associate for north central Kansas, which is in the works. What I will add is that I am looking forward to developing a partnership with NAMI because of how it could directly benefit both United Methodist Churches in Concordia.

And that doesn't even touch upon the other things that are keeping me busy right now, but what I will say is that all of this is a blessing, and I hope it is a blessing to all of you in time. All I know right now is that I am delighted to be serving in Concordia and I am profoundly grateful for all of the folks in our churches. At any rate, I guess you could say I'm pedaling as much as I can right now.


Hay Rack Ride






