Pastor's Pedalings,

"Jonah prayed to the Lord his God from the belly of the fish: 'I called out to the Lord in my distress and he answered me.'" ~ Jonah 2:1-2a

Jonah was stuck. He was stuck with a call he didn't want because it meant doing something he didn't want to do. So, he tried running away from that call until the boat he jumped on was threatened by the sea, and he knew he was the cause of it, so he told the boat's crew to toss him overboard; they did, and the sea calmed. Then, Jonah ended up in the belly of a big fish.

Talk about stuck.

Jonah would find himself stuck again but the point is, sometimes people get stuck. Historically when people get stuck, they become more and more anxious, and anxiety can spread like an emotional parasite throughout large and small groups of people.

Throughout history, there have been numerous examples of bodies of people who got stuck. Some would argue that Jesus came into the world when he did as a way to address the stuck-ness of the ancient Judean religion, the stuck-ness of oppressed people, and even the stuck-ness of the Roman Empire. Some would say stuck-ness led to the split between the Eastern and Western churches around 1,000 CE. Some would say stuck-ness brought about Martin Luther's 95 theses and the reforms that came with St. Francis of Assisi. History indicates that European society was stuck before Christopher Columbus sailed across the Atlantic and ran into North America. John and Charles Wesley ended up forming a new denomination because they could see the Church of England was stuck.

How many more historic examples can you think of? I've only mentioned a few but there are plenty others. What about personal examples – where you've felt stuck – and maybe you realized it and maybe you didn't. I know I can relate to that, as well.

Being stuck isn't fun. When societies or groups of people get stuck, anxiety rises, and when anxiety rises, it's an indicator that something else is going on. I've experienced that more times than I can count, and I've seen it as many if not more times than I even realize.

Sometimes the stuck nature of anxiety has people look for someone to blame – to scapegoat the way Jesus was scapegoated. Sometimes anxiety gets so intense that people freeze. Something else anxiety does is have people do the same thing over and over expecting different results. Crazy huh?

It's taken me years to understand something about anxiety and stuckness, however, and when I finally figured it out, it made more sense than anything I've noticed in probably the last 20 years.

The only way to overcome stuck-ness and anxiety is adventure. I think that's what God was helping Jonah understand in the belly of the big fish, and it's certainly what Jonah experienced when he marched through Nineveh, even though his expectations weren't met. What Jonah needed was adventure. I wonder if Jesus' life, death, and resurrection were something of a cosmic adventure. Martin Luther's work and St. Francis of Assisi's work was certainly adventurous. So was Columbus' work. And John and Charles Wesley's work.

So, as we approach this Advent season, what changes are you preparing to make? And as we enter into this final month of the year, what adventures will you engage in 2025? I know what mine are already and I am excited to get them started now. I think all the things that have held me stuck in the last few years was God's way of saying, "I'm about to do a new thing."

This time, my stuck-ness was different. I didn't feel my own anxiety (although I did feel the anxiety of others at times), and my stuck-ness didn't feel permanent; it felt like God was patiently moving me forward. God has been calling me to adventure like I've never adventured and used every aspect of all that is good, bad, and ugly about my life to make it happen. Nothing could be more exciting for me because it has given me focus like I haven't felt since I went to seminary in 2002. All I know is that as I come out of all the fishy stuff in my life, my sense of serendipity has never been stronger, and for that I am truly grateful!

All I know is it's time for adventure, so let the adventures begin!

Eureka Springs, AR September 18-21, 2025




